



The role of chemical contaminants in food-chains is not greatly studied but is probably highly significant in causing raptor deaths.

Millions of tonnes of pesticides are sprayed on a prime food base of migratory raptors, namely locusts & queleas, this must have significant though poorly recorded consequences.

THE THREATS



Poisoning

Targeted and accidental.

Carbamate poisons are widely used used in East Africa to target predators that have killed domestic livestock.

Vultures feed on the carcasses and many die along with other non-targeted species (jackals, eagles, hyena, etc).

In Southern & West Africa the poisoning is targeted & vulture parts are sold for traditional uses (muti trade) or in witchcraft.

Poachers kill sentinel vultures to hide evidence of poached animals that may draw rangers in.




> Power

Lobby your power companies for change before it is too late!








